Rep. McGee Elected Vice Chair of Legislature's Black and Puerto Rican Caucus



Rep. Brandon McGee (D-Hartford) was chosen by his colleagues today as Vice Chair of the legislature's Black and Puerto Rican Caucus. The caucus elected its leaders following the swearing in of state representatives on the opening day of the 2017 legislative session. Rep. Christopher Rosario (D-Bridgeport) was elected as Chair.

“I am honored that my colleagues in the Black and Puerto Rican Caucus have entrusted me with the position of Vice Chair. The caucus has a long history of advocating for the advancement of African American and Latino American communities in Connecticut, and I look forward to continuing that legacy,” said **Rep.
