Notification Bill Prompted by Arrest of Local School Bus Driver Gets Public Hearing

Bill introduced by Rep. Linehan Requires Contractors Notify Towns of Employee Arrests

State Rep. Liz Linehan (D-Cheshire/Southington/Wallingford) announced that a bill she introduced to ensure town boards of education are notified when employees hired by contractors are arrested will receive a public hearing in front of the Education Committee this Thursday.

Rep. Linehan asked the Education Committee to raise <u>HB 5334</u>, An Act Concerning Notification By Contractors To Boards Of Education Regarding Incidents Of Arrest Of Employees, after learning of the <u>arrest of a Southington school bus driver</u> accused of sexually assaulting a girl for eight years.

The school bus company fired the driver following his arrest, but never notified Southington's board of education of the incident, raising concerns that the school district was denied the opportunity to investigate if the man had abused children through his position as a bus driver.

"That the Board of Education was never informed that a school bus driver was arrested for sexual abuse is terrifying to every parent of young children. Firing the individual isn't the end of it – the school district needs to be promptly notified so they in turn can notify the parents and conduct a full investigation," **Rep. Linehan** said. "I think people, myself included, were shocked to learn that notification in these instances is not already mandatory. We urgently need to fix this dangerous oversight."
