MANCHESTER DELEGATION URGES BOND COMMISSION TO PROVIDE CRITICAL FUNDING FOR LOMBARDO'S FARM

Town is expected to receive \$300,000 for preservation of the 102-acre open space

HARTFORD, Conn. – The Manchester State Legislative Delegation, which includes House Majority Leader **Jason Rojas** (D – East Hartford, Manchester), and State Representatives **Jeff Currey** (D – East Hartford, Manchester, South Windsor), **Geoff Luxenberg** (D – Manchester) and **Jason Doucette** (D – Glastonbury, Manchester) and State Senator **Steve Cassano** (D – Manchester), is urging the State Bond Commission to ensure that Manchester receives critically needed funding to support the preservation of the iconic Lombardo's Farm.

The Town of Manchester is expected to receive a \$300,000 grant-in-aid to support the preservation of 102 acres of Lombardo's Farm. Cared for by the Manchester Land Conservation Trust and a passionate group of local volunteers, the open space provides residents with space for activities like hiking, biking, and skiing, in addition to gardens, wildlife, and plant habitats.

"Lombardo's Farm is a unique community asset providing residents with the large open space for activities like hiking, biking, and skiing. Especially over the last year where we were all felt so cooped up, Lombardo's provided the opportunity to get outside and enjoy beautiful community gardens, wildlife, and plant habitats right in our own backyard. The funding provided by the bond commission will enable the Manchester Land Conservation Trust to continue its preservation of the property so residents may fully enjoy the space for years to come," said **Rojas**. "I thank the Governor, the State Bond Commission, and my fellow delegation members for the hard work done to ensure that Lombardo's Farm remains a community treasure."

"With 102 acres of forest, meadow, and wetland, Lombardo's Farm offers our neighbors the opportunity to get away and take a break right here in our community. Through the funding provided by Governor Lamont and the State Bond Commission with this grant, combined with the talents of Manchester Land Conservation Trust and so many local volunteers, we have a real opportunity to turn this open space into a regional asset," said **Currey**.

The State Bond Commission is expected to vote on Manchester's grants-in-aid along with other funding measures for communities across the state at its upcoming meeting on Friday, July 23.
