REP. HAMPTON STANDS WITH TEACHERS

State Representative John K. Hampton (D-Simsbury) has cosponsored a bill that would prohibit student performance data on the Smarter Balanced Assessment from teacher performance evaluations.

“This measure brings a level of fairness to teachers that are very much affected by any system of performance evaluation that is in place,” **Rep. Hampton** said. “I am proud to stand with our amazing, hardworking teachers and will be closely following this legislation.”

[Senate Bill #380](#) prohibits teacher evaluations conducted for the 2016-17 school years and each subsequent year from using Connecticut student mastery exam data as part of the student academic growth indicators required in all teacher evaluations. The bill allows standardized test results other than from the mastery exam to be used in teacher evaluation.
