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\$2.5 MILLION FOR HOSPITAL FOR SPECIAL CARE

State Representative Betty Boukus (D- Plainville, New Britain) announced state funding for Hospital for Special Care (HSC) is scheduled to be approved by the state Bond Commission. The Bond Commission has reserved a grant of \$2.5 million to be approved next Friday.

The supplemental grant-in-aid will assist in the acquisition and implementation of an electronic medical records system.

“I am so please that our hard work has paid off,” Rep. Boukus said. “I want to thank Governor Malloy and the Office of Policy and Management for working with us to make sure this funding would come to fruition.”

Hospital for Special Care, with locations in New Britain and Hartford, Connecticut, is the only long-term acute-care hospital in the nation serving adults and children. HSC is nationally recognized for advanced care and rehabilitation in the highly specialized areas of pulmonary care, acquired brain injury, medically-complex pediatrics, neuromuscular disorders and spinal cord injury.

“This money, designated for completion of our electronic medical record system, will ensure that our complicated patient population will benefit from these technological advances,” said John Votto, DO, President & CEO, Hospital for Special Care.

The state Bond Commission is scheduled to approve the funding during their May 27th meeting at 10:30 a.m. in room 1-E of the Legislative Office Building in Hartford.

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
